


World Trade Organization on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS Agreement)

WHAT IS THE SPS AGREEMENT?

The SPS Agreement applies to all sanitary and phytosanitary measures which may, directly or indirectly, affect international trade. Such measures must be based on science and must not constitute unjustifiable discrimination between Members or a disguised restriction on international trade.

WHY ARE SPS MEASURES IMPORTANT?

GOOD SPS MEASURES PROTECT:

- Human or Animal Life
- Human Life
- Animal or Plant Life
- A Country

FROM:

Risk arising from additives, contaminants, toxins or disease-causing organisms in food

Plant-or animal-borne diseases (zoonoses)

Pests, diseases or disease-causing organisms

Damage caused by entry, establishment or spread of pests (including weeds)

Compliance with the <u>SPS Agreement</u> requires modern Agricultural Health and Food Safety (AHFS) Systems.
